This addendum is issued to revise the original Request for Proposal, dated May 27, 2010 as follows:

1. The proposal due date remains the same: Thursday, July 8, 2010 no later than 2:00 p.m. exactly.
2. **CORRECTION:** Delete the last sentence in Section II, Part 5, #3A, and replace with the following:
A violation that is appealed at a taxicab hearing and is withdrawn, dismissed or set aside by the hearing examiner will not be counted.
3. **CORRECTION:** Delete the last sentence in Section IV, Part 2, #4, and replace with the following:
*For-hire driver license numbers must be ~~greater~~ **less** than 13402 to qualify for this RFP.*
Please note: If your *current* for-hire number is 13402 or higher, but you have split-service time with an earlier license, you must provide your old license number to document the required minimum of 5 years of experience.
4. **CLARIFICATION:** The term “Notice and Order” is interchangeable in this document when the term “Notice of Violation” is used. *Notice and Order* is the King County term while *Notice of Violation* is the City of Seattle term.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PROVIDED IN REGARDS TO QUESTIONS RECEIVED

Q1: How long does the “Driver Group” that is awarded the WAT licenses per King County RFP # 1036-RLD have to get their new WAT up and running - for example: 30 or 60 days, etc after they are awarded the license?

R1: 60 days from the date the licenses are awarded.

Q2: These new WAT will have to be dispatched by one of the current Seattle/King County Taxi Associations is that correct?

R2: The entire Driver Group must affiliate with the same taxicab association licensed by the City of Seattle (see RFP 1036-10RLD, Section III, Part 1, #1).

Q3: Do these new WAT have to be covered under the same insurance company/policy that they are dispatched/affiliated with, etc?

R3: All WAT taxicabs must meet the insurance requirements as stated in King County Code 6.64.350 and Seattle Municipal Code 6.310.300.
